Meaning the whole week is based around celebration and having fun!

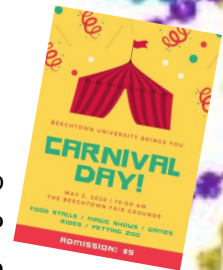

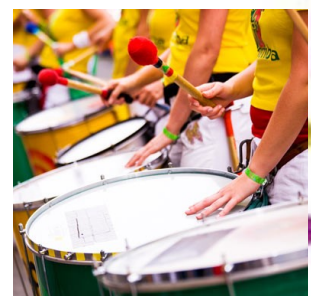

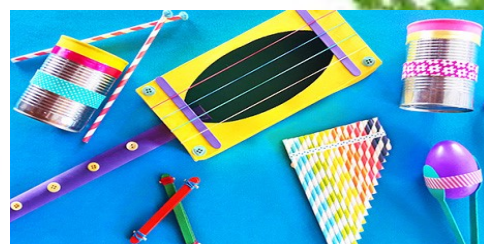


Why not have a go at some drumming or percussion music at home using samba rhythms?
